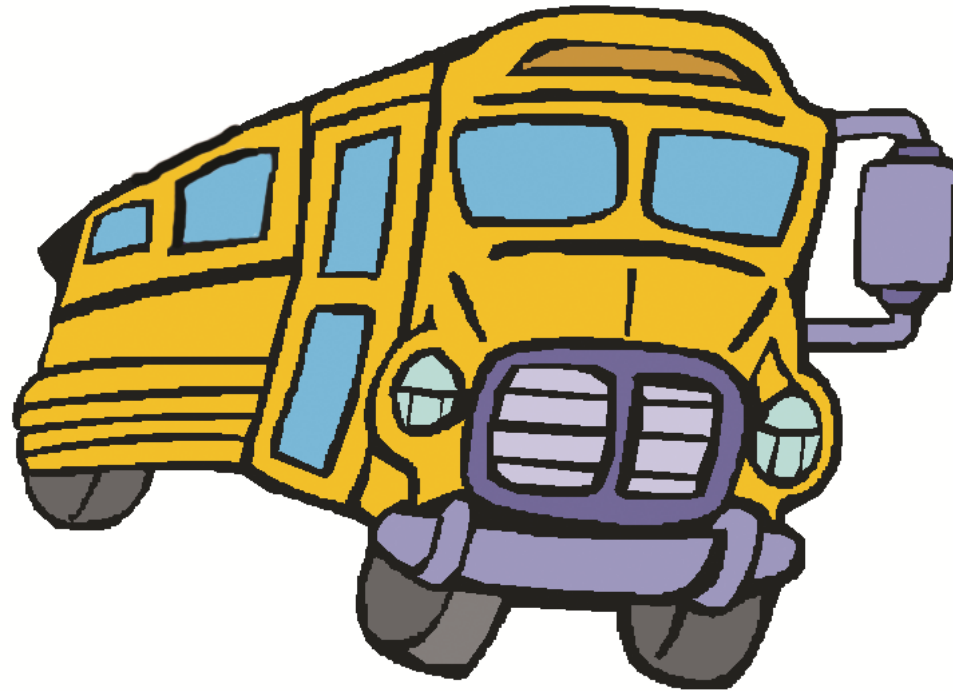

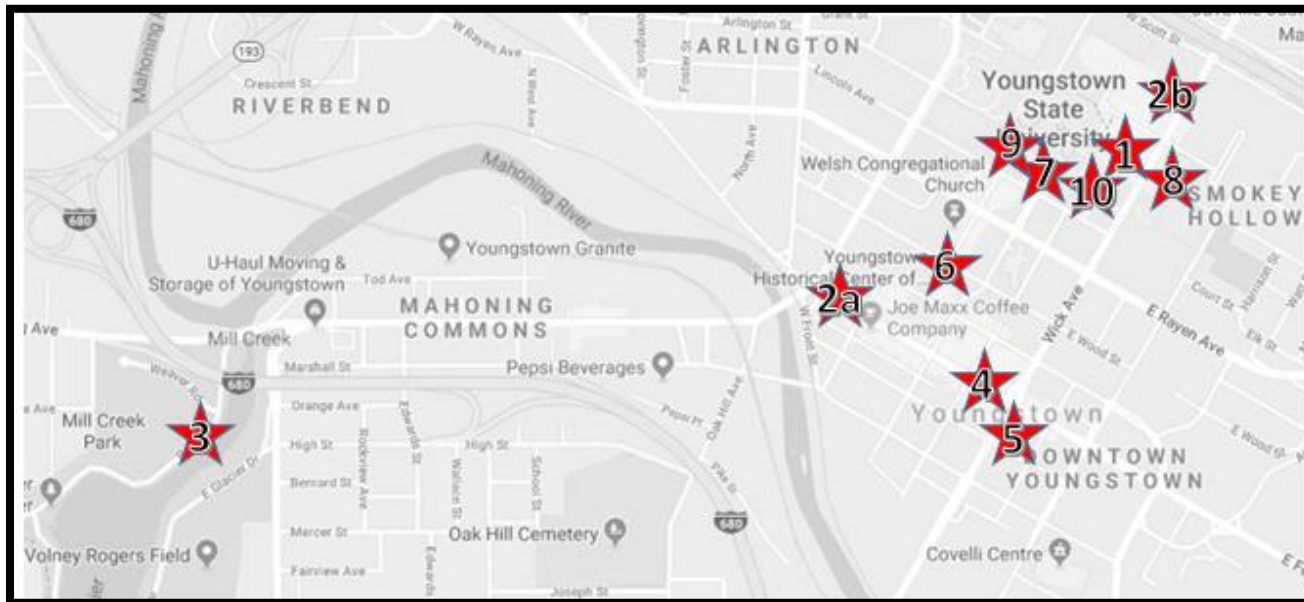

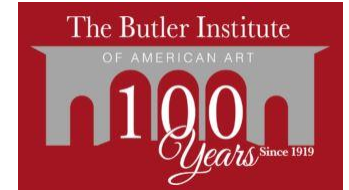

### Public Programs:

There is no charge for museum admission. Tuition art classes are offered for all ages (scholarships are available). Sweeney Children's Gallery is open during museum hours and offers hands-on interactive work stations for children and their families.

Some of the free monthly programs offered at the Butler include:

*Sunday Family Days:* Family programs are scheduled the third Sunday of each month (Oct., Nov., Jan., Feb., Mar., & Apr.) from 1:30 p.m. to 3 p.m.

*Stroller Art:* Gallery tour for parents/caregivers with infants to 24 months offered the first Thursday of each month, excluding December, at 10 a.m.

*Young Friends Adventure:* Art and activity for parents/caregivers with children 2-6 offered the second Thursday of each month, excluding December, at 10 a.m.

### Field Trip Information:

Earlier hours (before museum opening) available upon request through the museum tour director.

The museum experience is designed to enhance the classroom curriculum. Trained museum teachers (docents) lead all programs, which are one hour in length. Tours with an activity require one hour and a half. Teachers can choose from a list of presentations or a program can be designed for curriculum needs. Reproductions, slide programs, Power Point programs, and teacher resource packets are available on loan. 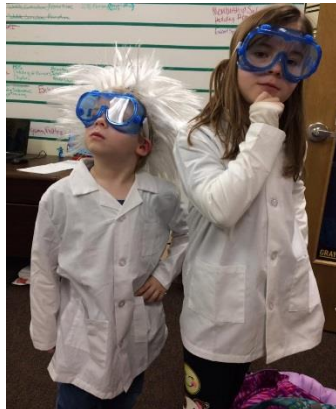

SMARTS, Students Motivated by the Arts, is a community art school that provides classes in visual arts, music, dance, theater, and creative writing for our region's PK-12 youth with a focus on underserved populations. SMARTS is located on the first floor of the historic Ohio One building in downtown Youngstown at 25 East Boardman Street. SMARTS currently serves thousands of students weekly through our after school classes in our downtown Youngstown location and in school districts and youth programs throughout the community during the school day and after school.

### Field Trip Information:

A visit to our facility will promote an appreciation & understanding of the people, industries & organizations that helped shape our community, region, state & nation. Guided tour & select activities are available for all students, from 4th grade through 12th grade. We also have specialized programs for students with special needs & students on the Autism Spectrum. Typical School tours are broken down into two, 30 minute segments (see below) with an optional 15 minute introductory video of Youngstown & steel making played before the tour or activities.

→30 minute guided tour— our regular tour takes groups of 15-20 through the exhibits as docents lead students on a tour of the museum & highlight the various elements required in the process to make iron & steel. Museum staff identify why steel production occurred in the Mahoning Valley, as well as discuss the role & importance of immigration & welfare capitalism to steel making.

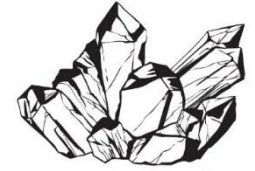
→30 minutes of hands-on activities—teachers may choose from the activities below. We will divide students into small groups to accommodate the activities & tours. (Choose one thirty minute program or two fifteen minute programs)

- Company Store (30 minute program)
- Hot Strip Rolling Mill Process (30 minute program)
- Wood versus Steel (15 minute program)
- Pattern Making/Sand Casting (20-30 minute program)
- Safety in the Mill (15 minute program)
- Primary & Secondary Sources (30 minute program)
- Poetry in the Mills (30 minute program)

Additionally, if no activities are required, a 45-60 minute tour can be adapted for students, please let the museum staff know ahead of time of your preference. Adjustments are available to suit your group's needs & schedule.

The Clarence R. Smith Mineral Museum features displays of over 450 unique and high-quality mineral specimens from around the world. Included in the collection are fossils, meteorites, petrified wood, gemstones, cabochons, and a fluorescence display. Admission is free.

### Field Trip Information:

Groups are highly encouraged to call ahead and arrange a tour. Requests for tours outside regular open hours or during the summer will be considered but are not guaranteed. Field trips are customizable to fit any age range or specific interests and can be oriented around a variety of Earth science topics and state standards. Large groups are typically split up, with half spending time in the museum while the other half completes an Earth science activity and then switching. ### About:

The John J. McDonough Museum of Art is the University Art Museum for YSU and the Valley's premier Center for Contemporary Art. The McDonough features changing exhibitions, installations, performances and lectures by regional, national and international artists. It also functions as public outreach for the Cliffe College of Creative Arts and Communication and the Department of Art, exhibiting work by students, faculty, and alumni.

### Field Trip Information:

At the McDonough field trips are typically presented for middle school through high school students, but all grade levels and age ranges are welcome. It is recommended that teachers call in advance to ensure the appropriate nature of the current exhibition for the age range of the students. Admission is free.

### Mobile Presentations:

The Melnick Medical Museum provides mobile presentations on a variety of medical history subjects. These presentations include real and replica artifacts related to the topic. The presentations can be done on the campus of YSU or in your classroom. Presentations are all free and around 45 minutes in length. The preferred group size is 30 or less. Please call or email to schedule a visit

- 19<sup>th</sup> Century Medicine: This presentation covers medical care in North East Ohio in the early 1800s including house calls, surgery, and the humoral theory. We talk about bleeding and purging and why those were the common treatment methods. There are a variety of medical artifacts and tools the students can touch. There is an optional medicine-making activity using mortars and pestles to prepare a tapeworm remedy from 1882. *(This presentation can be adjusted for any age group.)*
- Civil War Medical Advancements: This presentation covers the context of healthcare in the mid-1800s and what doctors learned from the casualties of the Civil War. We talk about the creation of the tiered medical system in the military and examine a typical surgical kit from the time period. *(This presentation is appropriate for middle school students and above.)*
- Polio and American Culture: This presentation covers the polio epidemics of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century and the treatment methods used, including the Iron Lung. It also includes the history of the polio vaccines and their ties to Youngstown in the trials of the early 1960s. It concludes with a brief look at the Disability Rights movement. *(This presentation is appropriate for high school students and above.)*

### Field Trip Information:

The Ward Beecher Planetarium offers a wide variety of programs tied to curriculum and aligned to such state standards as space science, Earth science, physical science, chemistry, biology and astronomy/history of astronomy (technology, scientific ways of knowing) for grades pre-school through high school and adults. New programs and topics are added continually. Programs may be presented live or recorded; most programs include a live segment on star and constellation identification. Student questions are encouraged. The best way to plan a field trip is to start with the Teacher's Guide at [www.wbplanetarium.org/teachers](http://www.wbplanetarium.org/teachers), which contains most of the information you need including a form to request a field trip. You may also email [wbplanetarium@gmail.com](mailto:wbplanetarium@gmail.com) or call (330)941-3619. Field trips are arranged on an individual basis. All programs are free and approximately one hour in length. There is a preferred maximum of 80 students.

### Public Programs:

The Planetarium offers public programs nearly every weekend at 8 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays and 2 p.m. on Saturday afternoons; the matinee programs are geared for families and children. Buses: For the mineral and medical museums and the planetarium, instruct bus drivers to travel westbound on Lincoln Avenue and drop off in front of your destination. For the art museum, instruct bus drivers to travel southbound on Wick Avenue and drop off in front of the museum. These areas may also be used for picking up your group. Buses are able to circle around campus and park by the stadium scoreboard.

Cars: Public metered parking is available on Lincoln Avenue at a rate of \$1.50/hour and the parking deck on Wick Avenue is available for a daily rate of \$5/vehicle. The John J. McDonough Art Museum has two designated spots for cars in front of the museum.
